

INFORMATION NOTE ON THE PROTECTION OF PERSONAL DATA

As required by Law no. 677/2001 for the protection of persons concerning the processing of personal data and free circulation of such data, as amended and supplemented, the Law no. 506/2004 on the processing of personal data and the protection of privacy in the electronic communications sector, Law 455/2001 on electronic signature and of the Government Decision no. 1259/2001 for the approving of the technical and methodological rules for the implementation of Law no. 455/2001, **S.C. DigiSign S.A.** must manage safely and only for specified purposes, the personal data you provide about yourself, a family member or another person. The purpose of data collection is: **electronic signature certification services, fraud prevention, electronic communications services, Internet services.**

You are required to provide the data since they are necessary for the issue of the **qualified certificates** (according to Art. 19, point 1 of Law no. 455/2001 on electronic signature). Your refusal gets us in the impossibility of issuance of such certificate.

The information recorded is intended for the use by the operator and they are released only to the following recipients: **ADACOM and VERISIGN Inc..**

Under Law no. 677/2001, you have the right of access, intervention on the data, the right not to be subject to individual decisions and the right to appeal to justice. However, you may resist the processing of your personal data and to request deletion of the data*. To exercise these rights, you can submit a written request, dated and signed to **SC DigiSign S.A., 15, Badea Cartan Street, sector 2, Bucharest.** Also the right to appeal to justice is recognized. Your data will be transferred to Greece and the United States, in order to fulfill the following services: **certification of electronic signature, electronic communications, fraud prevention, Internet services.**

If some of your data are incorrect, please inform us as soon as possible.

Note:

**Everyone has the right to oppose, for legitimate reasons, to the processing of his/her data. This right of objection can be excluded for the processing provided by the law (for ex.: Processing by financial and tax services, police, justice, social security). Accordingly, such remark must not occur if processing is binding; any person is also entitled to object, free of charge and without any justification, to the processing of personal data for direct marketing.*
